For this exhibition, curated by Emilie Boix, Laurence will present a body of work around the study of the light and its impact on colors and reflections. "It's fascinating to notice how light transforms the colors or how reflections are playful.".

Laurence de Valmy was born in 1974 in Africa and grew up in France and UK. She now lives and works in the New York area. She studied art at the University of Michigan and in France. Laurence de Valmy's work has been exhibited internationally and is present in several private collections in the US, Europe and Asia. Recent shows include the Ukrainian Institute, NY; Trygve Lie Gallery, NYC; Richelieu Drouot, Paris, France; Upcoming show in May 2016 at the FIAF Montclair, NJ.
